### 1.4.2 How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (Maximum 500 words)

The curriculum of the college is following the University norms. A well structured teaching strategy is followed by staff members. The activities of the students and teachers are recorded every year. They have interactive sessions and feedback collections on curriculum and other aspects. Every year, the Board of studies meeting has been conducted by each department with subject experts from various Colleges/Universities to change over and revise the curriculum syllabus. A well organized mentoring system is followed by teachers who are giving guidance to a heterogeneous group of 10 to 20 students in each programme. The college has computerized library with large number of books, journals, e-resources, audio visual aids and so on. The updated online courses like SWAYAM and MOOC are introduced for the benefit of staff and students.

Audio visual aids besides all facilities in the library are useful to frame the curriculum. Students' feedback and their grievances are redressed by the faculty members and council of the college. They take the opportunity to arrange tutors to rectify and resolve the grievances. The members who frame the curriculum make necessary changes in the syllabus for the upliftment of the students. Feedback from parents, alumni, teachers and also from students are being consolidated to the maximum extent to set curriculum and other aspects for the benefit of the students as well as the college. There have been interactive sessions with subject experts, students and alumni besides suggestions from industrialists and corporates are considered for resolving the existing programmes and introducing new programmes along with their courses.

The curriculum of the college is based on three main categories, such as skill based courses, courses for employability and courses for entrepreneurship. All the programmes of the college are based on these three to frame courses for the individual discipline. Elective papers are introduced for the students to select their own courses with their special interest in the name of Allied optional, Major optional and Supportive papers in various disciplines. Special coaching sessions such as NET/SET Classes, Spoken English and Alphabet club are conducted for students in order to develop

their communicative skills. A well structured communicative lab is functioning with effective and innovative English oriented computer programmes, aimed at employability of the students with good communicative skills. In a nutshell, the curriculum has all the possibilities to enrich the knowledge of the students.

## 7.2 – Best Practices

### 7.2.1 – Describe at least two institutional best practices

1. Physical and Mental Health Consciousness Physical and mental health are strongly interconnected. However, in the modern sedentary lifestyle little attention is paid towards activities related to physical and mental fitness. A poor physical health may lead to a mental disturbance and simultaneously a mental health problem can lead to physical health disorders. The institution pays equal attention for a comprehensive health improvement and social wellbeing of both students and staff. This is accomplished through three major activities:

- Yoga and meditation
- Sports and games for both Students and Faculties
- Fitness Centre activities

Yoga and meditation: Practicing yoga has both physical and mental health benefits. The College offers Yoga and Meditation as part of the curriculum for all the undergraduate students for the first four semesters. The curriculum has been framed by the VISION (Vethathiri Maharishi Institute for Spiritual and Intuition Education), an educational wing of the world Community Service Centre (WCSC) founded by Vethathiri Maharishi, a contemporary philosopher of 21st Century. The curriculum includes both philosophy and practices. The practices focus on the components of the SKY Yoga system [Simplified Kundalini], developed by Maharishi after years of his intense meditation, yogic practices and research. The SKY Yoga system includes:

- Simplified Physical Exercises for Health
- Meditation Practices for InnerPeace
- Kaya Kalpa Yoga for Antiaging Simple meditation techniques help to acquire sound mind and leads to selfrealization.

The course has been designed to inculcate moral and ethical values among the student community and to improve the discipline and culture of the college atmosphere. Sports and

games for both Students and Faculties: Competitive and recreational sports are conducted as per schedule during an academic year. Based on the enrolled list of participants, teams are formed for both staff members and students for various events. The events include both indoor and outdoor sports. Prizes are distributed to the winners of students and staff categories. These activities reduce stress among students and staff, thereby boosting their self-esteem.

Fitness Centre activities: The fitness centre has been fully equipped with amenities to carryout maximum physical exercises. Trained dedicated staff members guide the practitioners. All the students and faculty members benefit from the facilities.

2. Blood Donation Student volunteers donate blood on a regular basis which is a crucial element for ensuring a safe and reliable supply of blood. Blood donation groups are arranged regularly in association with Government Hospital Gobichettipalayam. Apart from the regular camps, donation of rare blood groups is also done round the year as on when needed.

### 7.3 – Institutional Distinctiveness

The College strives to impart the quality higher education to male and female students inhabiting the rural areas around Gobichettipalayam along with its prime motto knowledge, discipline and upliftment. In a year, the college receives a greater number of applications from low income families who aspire to educate their children despite their odds. The prominent role of our college in producing thousands of first generation graduates with distinction is a noteworthy contribution in the nation empowerment. Over the years, the college pays due attention in designing and delivering a need based curriculum.

Methodical planning, content enrichment, implementation and periodical evaluation have resulted in the transformation of present curriculum, thereby equipping the students with recent knowledge or skills as and when required. The college recognizes the educational needs of the weaker sections in the society and enrolls the wards of economically deprived sections by charging a nominal amount as tuition fee without collecting any capitation fee since its inception in 1968. Furthermore, the tuition fee is fully waived for students whose both parents are deceased. In a true sense, the educational need of a poor student is completely taken care, without compromising the objectives of a value based education. This to a larger extent has resulted in grooming them as responsible citizens of future India. In addition to helping the

needy, the institution ensures impartiality in the admission procedure too. This institution is a pioneer in successfully implementing and operating the 'singlewindow admission procedure' based on pure merit on par with Medical and Engineering admissions. We have a dedicated Women Development Centre to address the challenges and issues faced by the women community in the campus. A fully functional Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) is being constituted and functioning to meet out the various grievances. Apart from the curriculum enrichment through academic and research infrastructures, the institution provides opportunities to students to earn while learning to meet out their expenses. The College selects economically weaker students and offer parttime employment in library related activities. The scheme is so flexible that the selected students can work in their free hours and stipend is being provided by the Management. In ensuring the safety of the students, we have initiated a 'Group Insurance Scheme' for all the students in collaboration with New India Assurance Company Ltd. In the academic year 201819, eight students have got benefited through this scheme. Use of mobile phones and gadgets is strictly banned in the campus in accordance with the instructions from The Directorate of Collegiate Education, Chennai. However, the usage of gadgets is encouraged offcampus to keep up with assignments, class schedules and to access students' course materials (as part of flipped classrooms in Outcome Based Education) thereby bridging the gap between students, faculty and administration. The College has established an exclusive sports environment that matches national standards in delivering sports facility to the students. This includes a sprawling ground and an indoor stadium with modern amenities. A fitness centre with stateoftheart infrastructure established through funding by UGC is also functioning in thecampus.

#### 8. Future Plans of Actions for Next Academic Year

Focus will be given to increase the number of Addon courses. Plan to introduce Joboriented Post Graduate Diploma Courses in collaboration with reputed IT companies. Plan to establish Community Radio. The newly recruited faculty will be propelled to advance their research capabilities (Publications, M.Phil. / Ph.D. supervision). More number of faculty and students will be encouraged to Join the online SWAYAM Course conducted by UGC, NPTEL, AICTE, etc. Attention will be paid to increase the alternate power supply through renewable energy sources (Solar Energy). Actions will be taken to involve more number of participation of Government and NonGovernment Bodies (Local People) while conducting various awareness programmes. As an initiative to promote our National Game, an exclusive new Playground for Hockey will be developed. Students Exchange Programme with other Higher Education Institutions will be organized in India and Abroad.
